### 2. INTRODUCTION

The City of Burnet has been awarded a federal grant to construct a pedestrian crossing at Highway 281, near 4th, 5th, or 6th street, in the City of Burnet. Although the scope of work is limited at this point, in order to continue the project an environmental assessment is needed. The City has received an Environmental Review from HUD to procure engineering and other services to begin the project. One such procurement is the environmental assessment service.

The Respondent should provide information that indicates experience and expertise in the field including but not limited to the following:


